- 5. There is a need and desire to better match our health spans to our lifespans; 71% of adults over the age of 50 say they'd take a pill that would give them an extra 50 healthy years.

I am unsure what you think about all of this, but it is a report about all of you (and me too, now!). It is good for us to see the trends and to hope seniors are well cared for now and in the future. I think it is also good for us to remember we are eternal creatures, made for so much more than this. I love how most seniors believe this is the best time of their life and know they have more to look forward to in life! However would you take a pill if you could have 50 extra healthy years? The older I get, the more ready I am to go to a better place in the presence of the Savior. Let's keep talking about these things!

For our noon meal, we will serve a delightful salmon with nasturtium sauce, Caprese salad, and french potato salad.


Thursday, September 21st:




